What is SLoCaT?

SLoCaT is the global UN partnership on Sustainable Low Carbon Transport. The SLoCaT Partnership activities improve the knowledge on sustainable low carbon transport, help develop better policies and catalyze their implementation. Over 50 organizations have joined the Partnership, including UN organizations, multilateral development banks, technical cooperation agencies, NGOs, research organizations and other organizations.

Why a global Cycling **Coalition?**

In developing countries and emerging economies, there is an increasing and clear modal shift from non-polluting modes such as walking, cycling and cycle rickshaws to polluting motorised two and three wheelers, and cars.



The SLoCaT **Global Cycling Coalition**

Cycling holds enormous potential in enabling transport systems to become more sustainable. Cycling is key to AVOID and SHIFT strategies by providing sustainable mobility alternatives from door to door. Capitalizing its potential requires a thorough understanding of cycling in relation to notably mass transport on the part of local, national and global policy makers. Funding mechanisms do not leverage, or work even against investments in cycling. Investments are too low, and the scale is too small. The case for cycling needs to be scaled up, bundled and integrated with public transport and urban development plans.

In SLoCaT's work, it is recognized that cycling should get substantial attention. This urges I-CE to start a global community of cycling experts as a thematic movement across the partnership. The coalition should establish a critical mass of people and institutions to discuss cycling mobility and its relation to climate change and urban development.



The work of the **Global Cycling** Coalition

The Global Cycling Coalition envisions the inclusion of pro-cycling policies and plans in the sustainable transport and low-carbon transport agendas in a more systematic and effective manner.

The Global Cycling Coalition will realize this vision by understanding the link between cycling and climate change through research and case studies, and by using this understanding to influence national policies, change planning and policy, and support civil society movements. For instance:

- Promotion of cycling in the international climate-sustainable transport policy process;
- Focus on a framework to trigger governments to utilize climate funding for cycling inclusive sustainable transport;
- Substantiate cycling as a zero emission concept and promote it;

- Calculate the co-benefits of cycling;
- Create showcases.

This is all relevant for the work in SLoCaT's working groups on Data Collection, Post 2012 Instruments, Financing and Outreach & Policy Dialogue.
